## The Crucible WebQuest

Assigned: Monday, October 1, 2012

Due: Tuesday, October 2, 2012

The *Salem Society* was founded in the USA in 1888, by 33 men interested in "organizing a society for the increase and diffusion of factual knowledge. Since then, this organization has added a variety of persons to help them accomplish their goal. Recently, you and your group members were contacted by the society and asked to take jobs as researchers for the *Salem Society* magazine. Having decided to accept this employment, you have just been assigned to work together on the magazine's expose for next month's edition – The Crucible.

Task: Both the Salem Witch Trials and the McCarthy Hearings are embarrassing past events in American History. However, there are many misconceptions about the trails, and not a lot is known about Senator McCarthy and his men. In groups of 2-3, your job will be to research the Salem Witch Trials and McCarthyism through this WebQuest answering the following questions:

- 1. List those executed (how many?).
- 2. Who was the judge who presided over the trials?
- 3. Who was the pastor of the local church as the trials began?
- 4. Who was the pastor's slave, and where did she come from? What is her religious background?
- 5. What was the status of Elizabeth Proctor?
- 6. When did the trials take place? And where (cities)?
- 7. What were the different forms of punishment used (if found guilty of witchcraft) or coercion (methods to force people to confess themselves or accuse another) used during the trails?
- 8. Who put an end to the trials? Why?
- 9. What did the state of Massachusetts do for the survivors of those who were hanged?
- 10. What was the importance of land during this time and how would this have fueled a desire for your neighbor to be found a witch?
